Services rendered by teachers beyond regular work hours, including those rendered during weekends, holidays, and summer/long vacation, shall be subject to the grant of Vacation Service Credits (VSC) under DepEd Order No. 013, s. 2024, otherwise known as the Revised Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits for Teachers. For non-teaching personnel, authorized services rendered beyond regular working hours, or during Saturdays, Sundays, holidays, or scheduled days off, shall be credited as Compensatory Overtime Credits (COC) and may be availed of as Compensatory Time-Off (CTO), in accordance with CSC-DBM Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2004, as amended by CSC-DBM Joint Circular No. 2-A, s. 2005, subject to existing rules on approval, documentation, accrual, and utilization of COC/CTO.

Annex A**TRAINING ON STRENGTHENING EARLY LITERACY INSTRUCTION THROUGH
THE SCIENCE OF READING (SoR)****Professional Development Program Description:**

Every Key Stage 1 learner will develop strong foundational reading and numeracy skills, with proficient understanding of sound-symbol relationships and language expression, through evidence-based, systematic instruction aligned with the Science of Reading."

The division envisions equitable access to structured literacy materials, consistent teaching practices, and collaborative support systems to ensure all early learners build the competencies needed for long-term academic success.

Results objective: By the end of SY 2026-2027, KS1 learners will improve in foundational reading skills- specifically phonemic awareness, decoding and reading fluency-with at least 25% improvement in CRLA and classroom formative assessments results and a corresponding 30% reduction in the number of identified Low Emerging learners. This will be achieved through the consistent implementation of explicit, systematic, and evidence-based reading instruction through the implementation of daily Science of Reading-aligned routines and enhanced teacher capacity via re-orientation, SLAC sessions and coaching.

Application objective: Back in the workplace, the participants should have effectively deliver evidence-based, Science of Reading-aligned instructional strategies and daily routines in classroom teaching to effectively enhance learners' phonemic awareness, decoding, and reading fluency.

Terminal objective:

At the end of the program, participants shall be able to design and implement SoR-Based lesson plans that integrate the Big Six of Reading.

Enabling objectives: Specifically, at the end of each session, the participants shall have:

- demonstrated understanding of key concepts and principles of the Science of Reading and their application in foundational skill development;
- acquired and practiced specific teaching techniques, activities, and assessment tools for phonemic awareness, decoding, and fluency; and
- developed or adapted lesson plans and classroom routines aligned with evidence-based practices to address the needs of diverse learners, including Low Emerging readers.

Annex B**A.I.M. HIGH: A TRAINING ON ADVANCING AI MASTERY FOR SCIENCE TEACHERS**

The **AI-TPACK INSET** is a differentiated professional development program designed to strengthen science teachers' capacity to integrate artificial intelligence into teaching in ways that are ethical, practical, and aligned with learner needs. Grounded in the study findings, the program responds to the pattern that teachers are generally stronger in content knowledge, pedagogical knowledge, and pedagogical content knowledge, but less confident in AI-specific domains, particularly AI-Technological Content Knowledge and AI-Technological Pedagogical Knowledge .

Across the sessions, participants are expected to produce practical outputs such as ethical-use commitments, tool comparison guides, AI-supported science lesson plans, contextualized classroom applications, and workplace action plans. Overall, the INSET aims to move teachers from basic awareness of AI toward confident, responsible, and instructionally meaningful use of AI in science teaching with the terminal goal of designing lesson plans that are AI-aided.

Results objective:

Teachers will exhibit improved self-reported AI-TPACK ratings using the AI-TPACK Framework checklist. Students will be able to improve their performance in Science that will be manifested in improved outcomes in terms of their MPS in teacher-made assessments and national and international large-scale assessments.

Application objective:

Teachers should be able to develop and deliver AI-guided and AI-enhanced lesson plans and teaching and learning packages.

Terminal objective: By the end of this training, participants will be proficient in designing AI-assisted lesson plans with AI-guided contents and pedagogy.

Enabling objectives:

- Strengthen teachers' AI-TK, AI-TPK, and AI-TCK for science instruction.
- Design ethically sound, learning-aligned, and context-feasible science lessons using AI.
- Enhance the AI-TPACK of teachers by focusing on science representations, simulations, scaffolding, feedback, and classroom workflows.
- Build teacher capacity to prevent student misuse, overdependence, and inaccurate use of AI.
- Provide differentiated support for beginner, emerging, and more advanced AI users.

Annex C**MATH-UP: ENHANCING FOUNDATIONAL MATHEMATICS TEACHING THROUGH BIG IDEAS, RESPONSIVE PEDAGOGY, AND ASSESSMENT**

MATH-UP (Mathematics Achievement through Teacher Holistic Upgrading) is a data-driven capacity -building program and resource package for Key Stage 1 teachers that seeks to enhance foundational mathematics teaching through big ideas, responsive pedagogy, and assessment. It is designed to respond to learner performance gaps in the early grades and to support the effective implementation of the revised K to 12 Mathematics curriculum.

The program consists of ten sessions that are organized to guide participants from curriculum understanding to classroom application. It opens with an overview of the revised Mathematics curriculum framework and a presentation of learner performance data to establish the context, need, and direction of the training. This is followed by sessions on responsive pedagogy, particularly the use of concrete materials and manipulatives, as well as the purposeful use of technology to support mathematics teaching and learning in the early grades.

The core of the program focuses on the foundational content areas in Key Stage 1, namely Numbers, Measures, Shapes, and Data, as framed through the big ideas of the revised curriculum. These content sessions are intended to deepen teachers' conceptual understanding, clarify common learner difficulties and misconceptions, and strengthen their ability to design instruction that is meaningful, developmentally appropriate, and aligned with curricular expectations. The program also includes sessions on assessment tools, strategies, and varied assessment approaches to help teachers design and use classroom assessments that provide valid evidence of learner understanding and inform instruction.

The culminating components of the program include the preparation of a workplace action plan, demonstration teaching, and commitment setting. These are intended to ensure that the learning gained from the training is translated into actual classroom practice and sustained through school-based implementation. In this way, MATH-UP serves not only as a training intervention but also as a support mechanism for improving instructional quality and learner achievement in foundational Mathematics.

As a professional development initiative, MATH-UP affirms that improving learner outcomes begins with strengthening teacher capability. By equipping teachers with deeper content understanding, responsive pedagogical strategies, and sound assessment practices, the program seeks to build stronger foundations for mathematics learning among Key Stage 1 learners and to support the broader goal of improved educational outcomes in the Schools Division.

Results objective:

By the end of the school year, the implementation of MATH-UP shall contribute to improved learner performance in Key Stage 1 Mathematics, as evidenced by an increase in Mathematics Mean Percentage Scores (MPS) and a measurable improvement in Rapid Mathematics Assessment (RMA) proficiency levels, with the aim of reducing by at least 10% the number of learners performing under the Not Proficient and Low Proficient levels.

Application objective:

By the end of the program, participating Key Stage 1 teachers shall be able to

apply the principles and strategies gained from the training by designing and implementing at least one data-driven lesson plan per quarter, supported by appropriate pedagogical strategies, assessment tools, and learner remediation or enrichment measures.

Terminal objective:

By the end of the training program, participants shall be able to design a lesson plan that integrates foundational Mathematics content, responsive pedagogy, and assessment practices consistent with the revised K to 10 Mathematics curriculum.

Enabling objectives:

Specifically, at the end of each session, the participants shall have:

1. explained the revised curriculum framework, facilitating facets, supporting components, content domains, Key Stage 1 standards, and results of Rapid Mathematics Assessment and Mean Percentage Score as the basis for the program;
2. demonstrated the use of manipulatives through the use of Concrete Representational-Abstract progression in early mathematics instruction;
3. selected and utilized appropriate technology and teaching-learning resources to support mathematical understanding and engagement;
4. unpacked the Key Stage 1 content expectations for numbers and early algebraic thinking;
5. unpacked the Key Stage 1 content expectations for measures in meaningful and real-life contexts;
6. unpacked the Key Stage 1 content expectations for basic shapes, spatial sense, and geometric reasoning;
7. unpacked the Key Stage 1 content expectations for collecting, representing, and interpreting simple data;
8. designed classroom-based assessment tools and strategies aligned with the curriculum and the desired cognitive demand; and
9. prepared a demonstration teaching plan, workplace action plan, and implementation commitment for classroom application.
